Founded in 2001, Voices of September 11th (VOICES) is a nationally recognized 501(c)(3) organization that provides a wide range of support services to meet the evolving needs of those impacted by the 9/11 attacks, commemorates lives and stories and advocates for reforms to protect the nation.

With offices in New Canaan, CT and New Brunswick, NJ, VOICES membership has grown to over 9,100 including 9/11 families, rescue workers and survivors in the United States and abroad.

VOICES is committed to keeping the 9/11 community informed on a wide range of 9/11 issues through e-Newsletters and mailings, comprehensive website, calendar of events, information forums and commemorative events as well as 9/11 Living Memorial workshops.

VOICES provides services in partnership with organizations such as the Clinton Global Initiative, National September 11 Memorial & Museum, National Child Traumatic Stress Network, Library of Congress and the US Department of Education.

Founding Director Mary Fetchet is a clinical social worker who lost her 24-year-old son Brad on September 11, 2001. Her dedication to the 9/11 cause has earned numerous awards including the National Justice Award, Connecticut Hero Award, ABC Person of the Year, American Red Cross Award, Rotary Foundation Paul Harris Fellow.

### Day of Remembrance Events

VOICES hosts annual Day of Remembrance events in New York City and New Jersey providing an opportunity for families to gather each anniversary to honor those who perished. The commemorative events include programs that support the ongoing needs of the 9/11 community including expert-led panel discussions, roundtables and presentations.

### Building Bridges Award

VOICES presents an annual Building Bridges award to individuals who have made significant contributions to the 9/11 community. Past recipients include: 9/11 activist Beverly Eckert, Co-Chairs of the 9/11 Commission Governor Tom Kean and Lee Hamilton as well as the New York Times for their series Portraits of Grief.

### 9/11 Living Memorial Project

VOICES 9/11 Living Memorial Project is an on-line tribute that chronicles the lives of the nearly 3,000 lost at the World Trade Center, the Pentagon and Shanksville, PA. The project empowers families, survivors, rescue workers and corporations to create a historical record in their own voice so that future generations will Always Remember.

Living Memorial workshops are held weekly throughout the tri-state area. Starting in 2010, VOICES outreach will broaden nationally and internationally to include families and survivors across the nation as well as 90 countries around the world.

VOICES 9/11 Living Memorial, currently on-line at [www.voicesofsept11.org](http://www.voicesofsept11.org), will be a core component of the National September 11 Memorial & Museum at the World Trade Center site in New York City.

### Advocating for Public Policy

VOICES advocates on a wide range of 9/11 issues including the needs of victims of terrorism as well as reforms to keep Americans safer and better prepared for emergencies on local, state and federal levels.

Mary Fetchet along with other 9/11 family members successfully advocated for creation of the 9/11 Commission and reforms based on Commission recommendations. She recently served on the 2009 Homeland Security Alert System Task Force and has testified several times before Congress.
